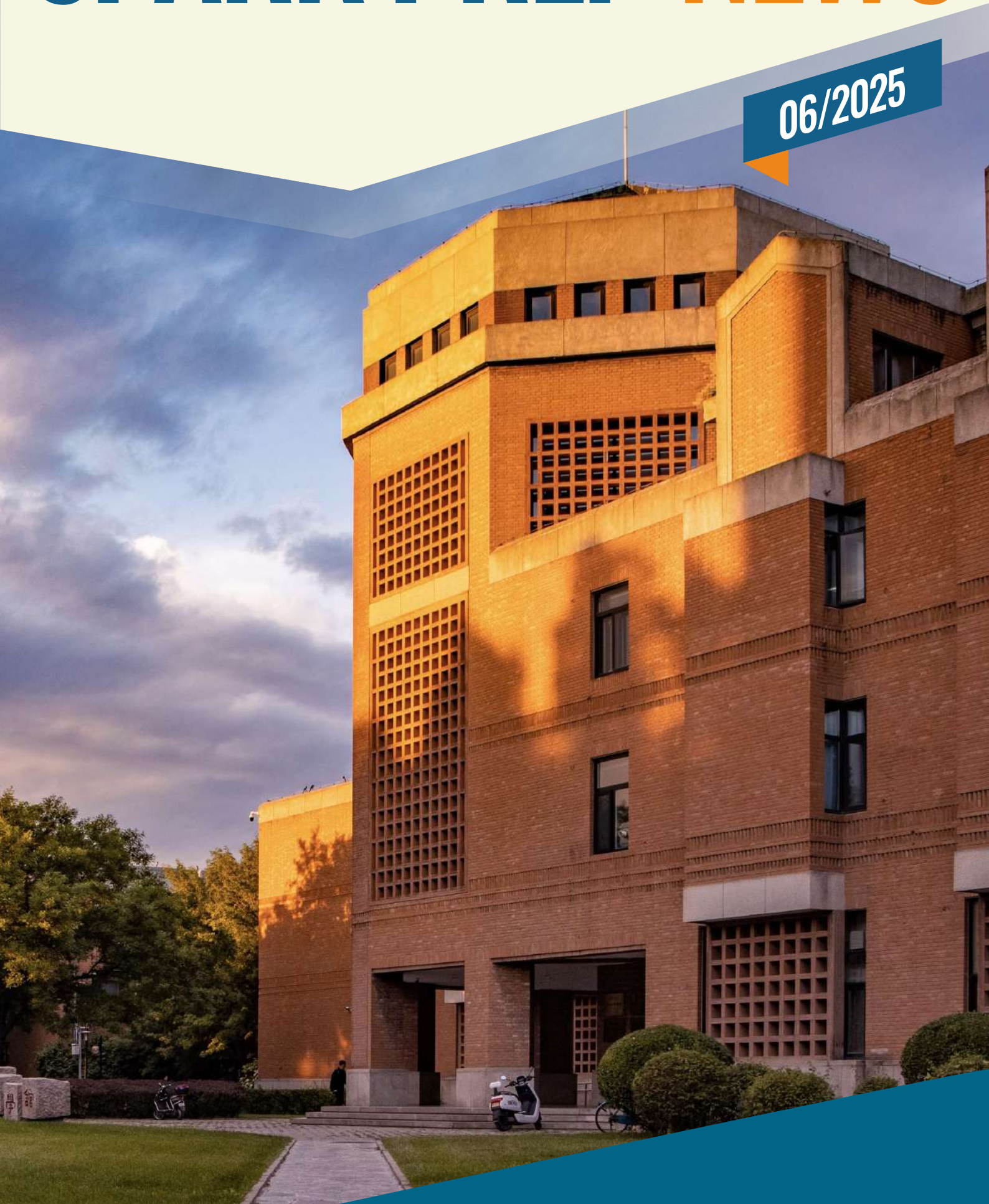

## NGOC BAO

### The Meticulous, Courageous Girl on a Mission to Heal Through Science

#### Finding Her Life's Purpose Through the Lens of Science

Bảo is a boarding student at Lake Forest Academy in Illinois. With a perfect **4.0 GPA**, a rigorous AP course load, accolades from Science Olympiad, research experience, competitive sports, and a passion for writing, she stood out not just for her intellect but for her unwavering clarity of purpose.

But what made Bảo's journey truly remarkable wasn't just the numbers. It was her deep-rooted vision of becoming a biomedical researcher—one who could bridge the wisdom of Eastern and Western medicine to develop holistic healthcare solutions for her community.

#### Choosing a School That Sees the Whole Person

Bảo received offers from several prestigious universities: UC San Diego, Boston University, New York University, and Vanderbilt.

She chose Vanderbilt University because she saw more than just academic excellence. She saw a community that values not only research and technology but also the beauty of cultural intersection—something that deeply resonates with her identity.

At Vanderbilt, Bảo envisioned the opportunity to pursue interdisciplinary research in biomedical engineering, where technologies like human system simulation open new possibilities for healthcare innovation. But even more, she found a place that embraces multicultural voices—where her passion for East-West integration could truly thrive.

#### Self-Discovery Through Small Moments

In her personal essay, Bảo wrote about a transformative internship in Singapore—a summer that pushed her out of her comfort zone, forced her to rely on herself, and helped her confront fear with courage.

Her reflections came from the smallest of moments: a stranger guiding her home when she was lost; a taste of local food that stirred up memories of her Vietnamese roots; a bus ride that reminded her how important human connection can be.

In that unfamiliar setting, Bảo found comfort not in control but in her own willingness to adapt. She learned to seek connection, embrace discomfort, and open herself to experiences she hadn't planned—experiences that later became defining opportunities.

"I'm a meticulous planner," she wrote. "But I can also choose to explore and persist." That sentence marked a clear turning point—one where Bảo's mindset expanded, and her confidence blossomed. The Singapore internship became more than a line on her résumé—it became the launchpad for a more grounded, more resilient version of herself.





## A Strategy Rooted in Authenticity

Bảo's journey is proof of a quiet truth we often forget:

You don't need to be loud or perfect to succeed.

You just need to know yourself, tell your story clearly, and tell it with heart.

Her application told a cohesive and powerful story:

- **From academics to research:** Her international internships weren't just accomplishments—they were milestones of personal growth.
- **From athletics to resilience:** Bảo's long-term commitment to swimming and badminton, across leadership roles and team contributions, reflected not only her discipline but her ability to find balance in rigorous environments.
- **From personal essay to personal truth:** Her writing didn't rely on grand, flashy moments, but on thoughtful reflections that revealed depth, values, and maturity.

As Bảo shared with us:

"Thanks to the thorough guidance from my mentors, I did not just get better at expressing my ideas. I also discovered my own writing voice. Each essay became less of an obligation and more of a chance to understand myself and tell my story in the most honest and thoughtful way possible."

Her insight reminds us that when students take the time to dig deep and reflect honestly, their stories naturally become powerful. They don't need to pretend to be someone else to be impressive—who they are is already enough.

With a GPA of **9.6/10** and an **IELTS score of 7.5**, Phương built a strong academic foundation that gave her the confidence to apply to top Canadian universities. After receiving offers from Calgary, Concordia, WesternU, and the University of Toronto, she ultimately chose McGill University to pursue Economics.

Throughout high school, Phương devoted herself to debate. As Vice President of CAM Debate, she secured sponsorships, organized the annual summer debate camp, and led the club to the title of Outstanding Club of the Year. Debate not only taught her how to stand up for her opinions and manage a team, but also helped her discover her own voice.

What truly made Phương's application stand out was her diverse and meaningful volunteer work. She taught English to orphans at EdBuds, supported sustainable tourism projects with V.E.O, and managed finances for Z Concert, where she raised funds to build libraries and playgrounds for children in remote areas. She also joined environmental projects such as tree-planting and book/cloth recycling, while running FEqual, a gender equality project on TikTok that attracted thousands of views. Each activity not only strengthened her profile, but also reflected her deep desire to use her skills and time to create value for the community.

Beyond academics and volunteering, Phương has a passion for music. She plays piano and performs at school events, while also contributing to Lam Son Radio's event team, which engaged a large number of students.

In her personal essay, Phương shared her journey caring for her sister, who has been ill. At times, she felt "stuck" in the role of caregiver, having to put aside her own plans. But one day, when she received a drawing from her sister celebrating her debate club victory, she realized that love was the reason she always ran to her sister's side—no matter how hard it was.

By choosing **McGill University**, Phương carries with her all these experiences—debate, volunteering, music, event organizing, and above all, the love of family—into a new journey. # NGUYEN TRAN THUY ANH

## Finding Joy in an Imperfect Journey

Thuy Anh is an outstanding student with a GPA of 9.3/10 and an IELTS score of 8.0. Throughout high school, she worked tirelessly and earned numerous achievements to be proud of: Third Prize in the National English Competition, multiple regional public speaking awards, and the Ethnic Minority Academic Excellence Scholarship for being one of the top-performing students in her area. Thanks to her strong academic record and dedication, Thuy Anh received generous financial aid offers from several U.S. colleges, including Knox College, DePauw University, and Rhodes College.

But what shaped her the most wasn't just the numbers. Thuy Anh once shared that she had always wanted everything to be perfect — from a neatly organized room and perfectly aligned bookshelf to every student project she joined. It wasn't until one day, seeing her little cousin scatter the books all over the shelf, that she realized something important: sometimes, it's the messiness that teaches us to appreciate the process — and connect more deeply with the people and world around us.

During high school, Thuy Anh co-founded **Meraki**, a nonprofit project that provided English lessons and emotional support to students during the pandemic. Thanks to her persistence, the project reached over 5,000 students and directly supported more than 300 children. She also founded her school's **Dee-Unde Culinary Club**, which began as a fun idea but grew into a space where she and her peers learned about leadership, communications, and fundraising for community projects. Those experiences didn't just give her practical skills — they built a small, caring community that she deeply cherishes.

Beyond school, Thuy Anh participated in various volunteer initiatives — from collecting warm clothes for children in the northern highlands and fundraising for Mid-Autumn Festival gifts for orphans, to assisting in educational summer camps. Despite her busy schedule, she always found time to bring a bit of joy to others.

The most valuable lesson she's learned through all these experiences is that things don't have to be perfect to be meaningful. By learning to let go of pressure, Thuy Anh has found joy in simple conversations with family, in the preparation for competitions, and in every club meeting she takes part in. For her, growing up isn't about collecting more titles — it's about learning to enjoy the journey and cherishing the connections that make it worthwhile.

## TRONG NHAN

### From Behind the Camera to Data Science

Among more than ten admission letters from prestigious universities in the United States, Trong Nhan chose Temple University as his next destination - with a **\$48,000 scholarship** to study **Statistical Science & Data Analytics**. Before that, he had also received generous scholarship offers from institutions like St. Lawrence (\$35,000/year), Drake (\$31,000/year), Carroll (\$30,800/year), Seattle (\$25,300/year), Duquesne (\$23,000/year), Portland, Suffolk, DePaul, and others - ranging from \$14,000 to \$35,000 per year. These numbers not only reflect recognition of his academic achievements but also serve as proof of a quiet, steady journey of growth throughout his high school years.

#### Everything Started with Silence

Before he became known for leading media projects at school, Trong Nhan was once a shy, reserved student with almost no extracurricular activities in the early years of high school. The prolonged social isolation caused by the pandemic made it even harder for him to connect with others. At one point, he shared that he didn't make a single new friend during his first semester. Things began to change when he decided to try joining a club - VinUnion. He passed the first interview round but... withdrew due to anxiety. It was a setback that shook his confidence. But instead of giving up, he chose to try again - this time with a newly formed astronomy club: The Asteroids. He applied for the position of video editor - a behind-the-scenes role that suited his introverted nature - and that was the first door that opened up a path toward connection.

#### Telling Stories through Visuals - and Data

Nhan taught himself how to use OBS and edit videos with Adobe Premiere through YouTube tutorials. He produced The Asteroids' first member recruitment video - a simple but creative piece that told a story about space exploration... through Minecraft. The video was highly praised by the organizing team and gave him his first real sense of community - something he once thought he wasn't capable of belonging to.

After this initial success, he continued to sharpen his media skills by taking on roles like Head of Design at VTEC, Head of Media at VTSC, and Lead Editor for various school video projects. He became the familiar face behind student videos - from educational content to school event highlights. Later, during his internship at FPT Telecom as a marketing intern, he expanded his storytelling abilities into the corporate world - learning SEO, blog writing, and product video production.

Though his journey began in media, Trong Nhan gradually discovered a growing interest in understanding the logic behind human behaviors - which led him to the world of data. To him, data is also a form of storytelling: sharp and objective, but if put into the right context, it can touch people's hearts, shift perspectives, and influence decisions.

#### Stepping Out of the Comfort Zone

Beyond media, Trong Nhan also invested time in community work. He taught literacy to ethnic minority children in Lo Lo Chai through the Volunteer for Education program and helped organize Z Pitch, a competition for high school social enterprise ideas. He studied Japanese, maintained regular fitness routines, and never stopped learning from every experience. Every activity, big or small, became a stepping stone helping him overcome his initial insecurity and believe in his unique value.

## PHAN TUONG ANH

### From a Small Desk to the Doors of a Dream University

“I’ve learned that creativity isn’t about waiting for everything to be perfect before starting. It’s about starting, and letting things gradually become better. Just like my character Mr. Knight—each new version was a step forward, and the process itself was the most beautiful part.”

#### The student behind the story

Among countless admission offers and generous scholarships from U.S. universities, Phan Tường Anh chose **Dickinson College** as his next academic destination. Dickinson awarded him a financial aid package worth 7 billion VND (approx. \$280,000 USD) for four years of study.

Before that, he had also received substantial scholarships from many prestigious institutions: Augustana (\$43,000/year), Knox (\$48,000/year), DePauw (\$47,000/year), Gustavus (\$40,000/year), Beloit (\$53,000/year), Rhodes (\$51,000/year), Centre (\$49,000/year), and Kenyon (~\$70,000/year).

With an **SAT score of 1510**, **IELTS 8.5**, and a list of provincial-level academic awards, Tường Anh stood out not only for his academic ability but also for his diverse extracurricular portfolio—ranging from design, photography, and robotics to TED translation and international research.

The driving force behind his success comes from a simple but steadfast belief: “If you put your heart into something, do it well—whether it’s in academics, creativity, or personal projects.”

#### Choosing a school based on values and fit

For Tuong Anh, choosing a university wasn’t just about picking a famous name. He prioritized environments that valued creative thinking, encouraged interdisciplinary learning, and nurtured a diverse student community.

Through his research, he found that the schools that fit him best were those where students were free to experiment, fail, adjust, and try again—just like the way he patiently created version after version of “Mr. Knight” at his small desk.

Dickinson stood out thanks to its small class sizes, close-knit learning environment, and direct access to professors—factors he believes will support sustainable personal and academic growth.

#### Discovering his own voice and story

What makes Tường Anh truly different isn’t only his academic record, but his creative perfectionism—something he captured in his personal essay about the months-long journey of “nurturing” his character Mr. Knight.

Before Spark Prep, he often worried that being “too meticulous” made him less adaptable. But through his sessions, he realized that this was in fact his unique strength—a reflection of persistence, creativity, and respect for the learning process. His biggest breakthrough was embracing the idea that “the first version doesn’t have to be perfect”—that value lies in the ongoing journey of refining and improving.



# TUNG SON

## From Compassion to Courageous Leadership

Tung Son, a student at Olympia Schools in Hanoi, stands out not only because of his impressive academic record, with a grade point average of 3.91 out of 4, but also because of his strong determination and sincere curiosity. From an early age, he developed a deep interest in the field of economics and finance. This passion is reflected through a wide range of experiences, including researching the steel industry in Vietnam during an internship at a securities company, developing academic content at Avocado Prep, and leading meaningful community projects such as Parts, Fiventure, and Sun In The Box.

### Choosing a path that reflects his goals

Instead of following a predictable or traditional direction, Son applied to international university programs that are known for their strength in business and data analytics. He believed that these environments would help him grow in a well-rounded and meaningful way. His efforts were rewarded with admission letters from respected universities, many of which included valuable scholarships. However, for Son, these accomplishments represent more than personal success. They reflect a long journey of growth that was guided by empathy, patience, and perseverance.

### Selecting a university that shares his values

Son did not choose universities based only on rankings or popularity. What mattered most to him was finding a learning environment that shared his values. He looked for places that encourage students to ask questions, take initiative in learning, and care about the people around them. During his research process, Son directly contacted current students, carefully read through academic programs, and explored each school's personalized support systems. His list of universities was not shaped by pressure from others, but by a clear understanding of his own needs, dreams, and identity.

### Becoming the Best Version of Yourself

Tat Dung is a 12th-grade student at Hanoi - Amsterdam High School for the Gifted, with an impressive GPA of 9.5/10, SAT score of 1500 (Math 790, EBRW 710), and IELTS 7.5. Passionate about business, critical thinking, and content creation, Dũng excels not only academically but also in extracurricular activities. He founded the first DECA club at a public high school in Hanoi, placed in the Top 3 at the BASF Innovation Challenge and Top 2 at the HSBC Business Case Competition, joined the Inspirit AI program, and freelanced for international YouTube channels. With a well-rounded and consistent profile, Dũng was admitted to Indiana University Bloomington, home to the prestigious Kelley School of Business.

#### A Very Ordinary Beginning...

Dung's study abroad journey didn't start with a shiny medal or high-profile achievement, but with a simple afternoon playing tennis with his father. As a child, Dung was always impatient—seeking something more exciting: video games, social media, quick entertainment. But watching his father calmly focus on each tennis stroke, on each breath, taught him a valuable lesson: the power of being present.

From a boy constantly craving the next thrill, Dung began learning how to stay with the moment. This shift in mindset slowly transformed the way he studied, worked, and connected with life.

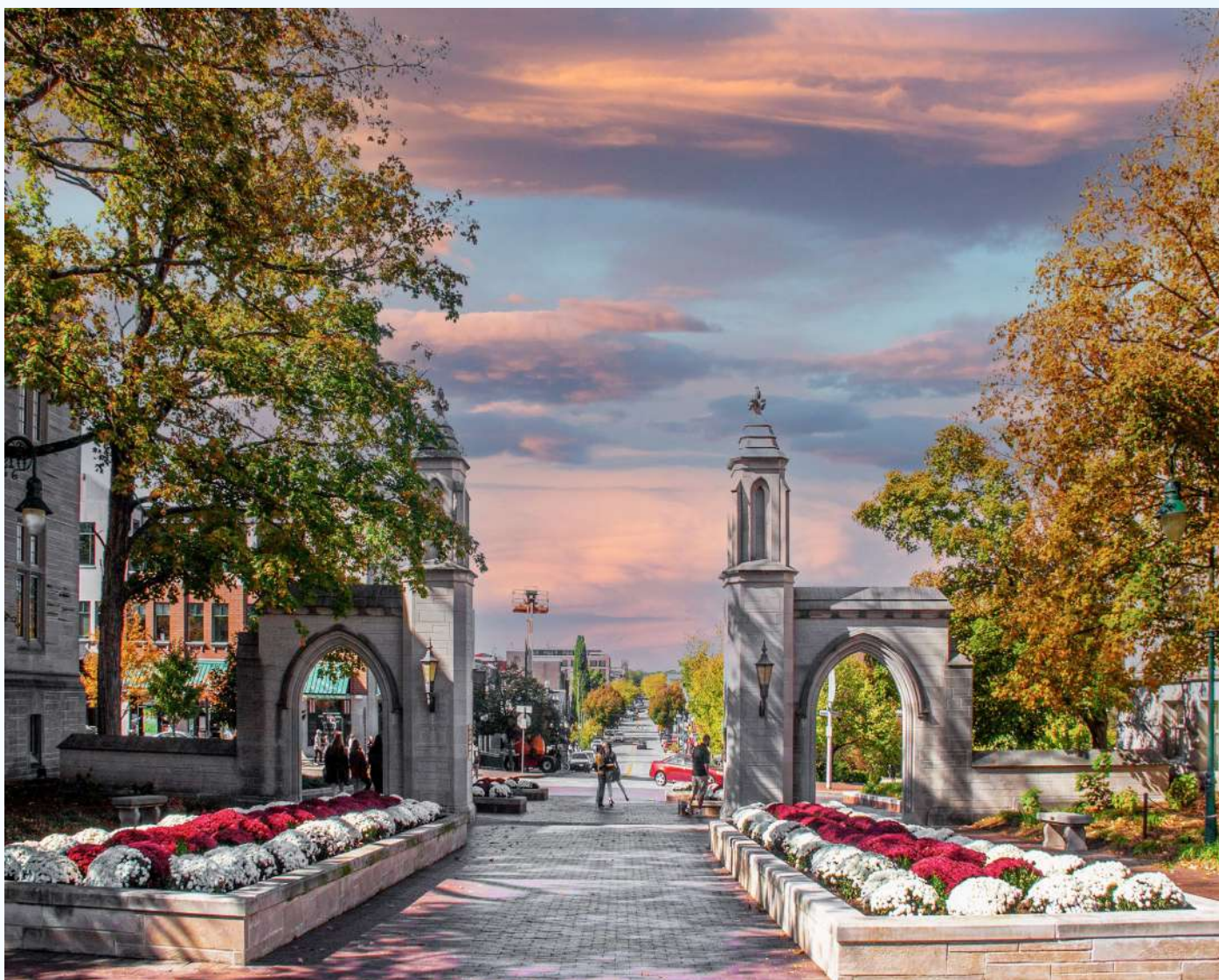

## Rutgers University

When I first started the college application process, I thought the hardest part would be preparing my grades or extracurricular activities because those are visible and measurable. But once I began writing my essays, especially the supplemental ones for each school, I realized this was the real challenge. Each prompt required a different approach: some asked me to reflect on small but meaningful experiences, while others pushed me to look inward and think about things I had never truly considered before. I felt confused and stuck, unsure where to even begin.

Thankfully, I had the close support of my mentors at Spark Prep throughout the process. They didn't just help me with brainstorming or structuring my essays; they helped me realize that writing these essays was something I could do. I came to understand that what mattered most wasn't writing something overly polished or academic but writing something real, something true to who I am. So I started writing every day. Some days, it was just a few simple lines, but the key was to keep going. Gradually, I learned how to organize my thoughts, filter what was meaningful, and connect scattered ideas into a complete piece. With each finished essay, it felt like I had taken another step forward in my journey.

Out of all the essays I wrote, I am most proud of my personal statement. I initially wrote a version that I thought was decent, but after receiving feedback from my mentors, I realized it did not truly capture who I was. It did not go deep enough into what really mattered. When I heard I would need to rewrite it from scratch, I felt overwhelmed and discouraged, especially since I had already invested so much time and energy into the first draft. But I chose not to stop there. I took time to reflect, to think things through again, and to rewrite with more honesty and focus this time. In just a short period, I completed an essay that felt authentic and deeply personal, something I could genuinely be proud of.

Looking back, the essay writing process was not just a part of applying to college; it was a journey of self-discovery. I learned to persevere, to overcome self-doubt, and most importantly, to believe that my story is worth telling. Without Spark Prep by my side, I do not think I could have come this far or felt this confident about who I am today.
